Out in the garden



Get your property looking its best for Christmas. Spray any weeds you have in the garden early so they will be sorted before all of your guests arrive. We have a range of weedkillers available to suit any situation.

Apply mulch around garden beds and shrubs to conserve moisture in the soil and give Your garden a uniform look. Daltons Mulch & Grow or Daltons Compost are both great for this purpose.

If you haven't already, apply a light dressing of lawn fertiliser to your lawn and water in thoroughly. This will give it a quick green up.

Watering – give your garden some thorough, deep waterings in the weeks leading up to Christmas. This moistens the soil down into the root zone, encourages plant roots to grow deeper and helps freshen up the garden.



Keep on top of pasture weeds with Buckshot!

Granules are easy to apply directly onto offending weeds. Tips: Keep some Buckshot granules in an old Pump water bottle on your farmbike or in the ute. When you come across a weed while out and about, you have a ready made granule applicator on hand.

Also if your crush the centre of the weed with your boot heel before applying granules, the weed will absorb the granules faster.

Scratch Treat Wreath for Chickens

Here's how to make one for your girls.

You'll need:
Cooking spray
Bundt Pan
1/2 Cup cool water
20gms unflavored gelatin
1-1/2 Cups Boiling water
1 Cup coconut oil
8 Cups of a mixture of Chook Treat, sunflower seeds, raisins, Wild Bird Mix
20 fresh or frozen cranberries
Ribbon



Instructions | Spray Bundt pan with cooking spray and set aside. In a measuring cup, dissolve the gelatin in the cool water and let sit for a minute. Pour the boiling water into a medium bowl and whisk in the gelatin to combine.

In a large mixing bowl, combine the Grains, Seeds, raisens and nuts, stir in the coconut oil and then pour in the liquid gelatin. Mix well with a wooden spoon to be sure all the nuts and seeds are well-coated and all the liquid is absorbed.

Place the cranberries in rows in the indentations in the pan (I used three in half the indentations and two in every other indentation) and then carefully spoon the seed mixture into the pan.

Press down with the spoon to pack it well.

Put the Bundt pan in the refrigerator overnight to set. The next day, take the wreath out of the refrigerator and let come to room temperature. Invert and tap gently on the counter top to unmold.

Tie a pretty ribbon in a bow at the top and then attach the wreath to your run fencing for your chickens or to a tree or fence to treat the wild birds.
