WINTER FEEDING

When considering a winter feeding programme for any animal, current body condition, type, age, growth/work demands, pasture quality and quantity must all be taken into consideration.

Winter environmental conditions put more demands on an animals body; immune systems are under stress and illness is more common, plus they will require more energy for everyday activities and for extra warmth.

Avoiding winter weight loss is important and it is essential to monitor the animal's body condition so that a management programme can be established before all the weight has fallen off.

Pasture during winter becomes scarce as growth is limited and where there is plenty of grass, it is predominately full of water with low digestible energy content.

Hay should be the first source of supplementary feed provided over winter as its digestion produces waste heat which will help an animal stay warm.

For those animals with extra demands during winter or those that do not hold their weight well, hay may not be enough and additional hard feeds may be required.

Tasks for July

July gardening focuses on preparing for spring growth and harvesting winter crops.

You can plant garlic, strawberries, and onion seedlings, as well as winter vegetables like leafy greens, brassicas, and root crops.

Start harvesting winter vegetables like broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, leeks, lettuce, parsnips, silver beet, and spinach.

As you harvest, dig over the soil, adding compost and manure to maintain its health - we have both available instore.

It's also a good time to prune trees, feed spring bulbs, and plant some summer-flowering plants like gladioli, tuberous begonias, dahlias, lilies, and calla lilies.

Spray deciduous fruit trees with a winter cleanup

spray (Lime Sulphur) to remove pests and diseases.

It's a great time to prune—always prune on a dry day after the dew has gone. Sanitise your tools between plants with methylated spirits or a hand sanitizer to prevent spreading disease between them.

Plant seedlings, like pansies, sweet peas, stock, lobelia, cineraria, and dianthus for instant winter color.


Cut back untidy growth of perennial plants like lavender, canna lilies, agapanthus, fuchsia and geraniums.



Garlic Instore—ready to plant NOW


Recipe that may help prevent rust on garlic:
